5. IFC PROJECT

P.R.I.M.E. Finance has teamed with the international law firm, Jones Day, to continue to support the efforts of the International Finance Corporation (a member of the World Bank Group) on a

major project to create an assessment framework that will help determine gaps in a number of developing countries' legal and regulatory framework for derivatives. P.R.I.M.E. Finance and Jones Day were selected by the IFC for Phase 3 of the project, which will build on P.R.I.M.E. Finance's work from the first two phases.

As part of the project, Rick Grove participated in two workshops in Cambodia in which he gave presentations on OTC derivatives for Cambodian government officials and regulators (March) and for representatives of the Cambodian banking sector and Cambodian government officials (June).
